Methods and Materials for Containment and Cleaning Up:

Stop leak if safe to do so and sweep solids into a pile and transfer into drums for subsequent disposal. Avoid generating dust. Provide adequate ventilation.

7 Handling and Storage

Precautions for Safe Handling:

Use of safe work practices are recommended to avoid eye contact and inhalation of dust.

Food, beverages and tobacco products should not be stored or consumed where this material is in use. Always wash hands before smoking, eating, drinking or using the toilet. Wash contaminated clothing and other protective equipment before storage or re-use. Provide eyewash fountains and safety showers in close proximity to points of potential exposure.

Conditions for Safe Storage:

Store in a cool, dry and well ventilated area. Keep container tightly closed when not in use. Keep away from strong acids and bases, chlorine trifluoride, ethylene oxide, halogenated hydrocarbon, oxygen difluoride, sodium nitrate and vinyl compounds.
